

Enjoy an highlights tour of the Museum's exhibits which will include footage from the first televised debate, the rocking chair President Kennedy used in the Oval Office, hand-painted closet doors from Mrs. Kennedy's dressing room, a piece of the Berlin Wall, just to name a few.
- Harvard University This is the oldest institution of higher education in the United States, established in 1636. It was named after the College's first benefactor, the young minister John Harvard of Charlestown.
- Museum of Fine Arts Meet some of New England's most talented artists. Over the course of an afternoon or evening, listen to an artist discuss his or her work. Discover the stories and inspirations behind their art and take the opportunity to ask questions.

- * Theme Dining Experience at Plimoth Plantation Take a savory journey into the past where entertainment and hospitality awaits you as you sit down to a 17th century meal filled with the finest food that the season of plenty has to offer.

A place to see, feel and taste history, Gloucester's working waterfront and ineffable beauty have drawn fishermen, artists and visitors for over four hundred years.
- * Guided Tour of Concord & Lexington Drive by significant historical sites, structures and landscapes, such as Minute Man National Park, Hartwell Tavern, Concord North Bridge and Lexington Battle Green. Reflect on the famous battle that started the Revolutionary War and the ideals that won the American people their freedom.
- * Explore Salem Discover the city's infamous past with a visit of Salem Witch Museum. Walk around the Maritime National Historic District, a National Historic site consisting of 12 historic structures along the Salem Harbor. This area features the 1819 Salem Custom House, the historic trade area of Derby Wharf, and exciting gateway to the sea, Pickering Wharf. Another great Salem attraction is The House of the Severn Gables, one of America's most beloved historic homes, best known today as the setting of world-renowned American author Nathaniel Hawthorne's 1851 novel.
