Greater Boston & Cambridge



- **Walk into History** – Led by a period costume dressed guide, follow the Freedom Trail and visit landmarks of the Revolutionary Era, including the site of the Boston Massacre, famous Faneuil Hall, Paul Revere's House, historic burying grounds, the storied steeple of the Old North Church, and much more!
- **Hop-on a Boat** – Whether it is taking the ferry to Salem, the ferry to Provincetown, a whale-whale watching excursion or a thrill ride aboard the Codzilla... There is something about being on the water and smelling the salty fresh air!
- **Travel back to early 1960s** – Visit the John F. Kennedy Library & Museum for an engaging and interactive look at one of the most important times in American history.
- **Hot dog, Peanuts & Ball** – Baseball, Basketball or Football; Bostonians love their sports, it is part of the city's DNA. Being a sports fan or not, take a seat among them and you will automatically feel their contagious palpable energy.
- **"Destruction of the Tea"** – Be part of the famous event that forever changed the course of American history through a multi-sensory experience that includes live actors, interactive exhibits, and full-scale replica 18th-century sailing vessels by visiting the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum.
- **Browse Faneuil Hall Marketplace** – Eat, drink, and be captivated at 14 restaurants and pubs including Cheers, McCormick & Schmick's and Ned Devine's Irish Pub. In addition, you'll find over 36 international food vendors inside of the Quincy Market Colonnade, the largest food hall in New England.
- **Harvard University** – Led by current students, take a walking tour of America's most prestigious and historic University
- **Art Lovers!** – Participate in a gallery highlights tour and see masterpieces from around the world inside the neoclassical style architecture of the Museum of Fine Arts.

- **Speakeasy Mystery Tour** – Begin with a guided tour of Newport's little-known Prohibition. Drive down Thames Street, a speakeasy heaven. Learn the story of the infamous rum running boat named the Black Duck.
- **Newport's Mansions** – During the Gilded Age, America's wealthiest families flocked to the "City by the Sea", making the area their summertime playground. Start with The Breakers, the grandest of Newport's summer "cottages" and a symbol of the Vanderbilt family's social and financial preeminence in turn of the century America.
- **State Pier Number 9** – Visit the only state-owned commercial fishing dock in Newport Harbor and home to nearly 60 full-time fishing vessels. Here the group will experience the everyday life of a shipyard and the personalities that make it unique.
- **Bowen's & Bannister Wharves** – Browse the one-of-a-kind shops, restaurants, and art studios. Brick walks, granite quays and 18th century buildings bring you back to Newport's days as a commercial seaport.



North of Boston

- **400 Years of Mysterious History** – Be part of a walking tour and learn about Salem's famous past, including the 1692 Hysteria of the Witch Trials, its haunted Seaport and more.
- **Salem Witch Museum** – Experience the drama of that dark time through thirteen life-size stage sets, figures, lighting and narration as they are witness to the web of lies and intrigue of the Salem witch-hunt.
- **Meet a Clairvoyant** – Get a peak into your future with one of the talented psychics specializing in Tarot, Palmistry and mediumship.
- **Take a Whale Watching Tour** – Cruise to Stellwagen Bank, a national marine preserve about 12 miles off the coast of Gloucester, to see and learn about the whales.



South of Boston

- **Eat like a Pilgrim** – Take a sit at Plimoth Plantation Living Museum and learn the 17th-century table manners that the Pilgrims brought to Plymouth. Meal includes a Plimoth Plantation Culinary Historian providing commentary and interpretation.
