### The Big Apple!



- **Get to the Top of the Rock** – Seventy floors above the city, enjoy 360-degree unobstructed view of the city and get the best picture shot of the Empire State Building.
- **See a Broadway Show** – Definitely a Must! From The Lion King to Hamilton, there's a show for everyone. A Broadway show is a play or musical presented in one of 41 theatres with more than 500 seats along in Midtown Manhattan.
- **Central Park Movie & TV Sites** – Take a walking tour through this world-famous park! See locations where more than 30 film and TV shows shot their scenes such as Law & Order, Glee, the Avengers and more!
- **9/11 Memorial & Museum** – Come to remember and pay respect to those who lost their lives. Learn about the history of the 9/11 attacks at the site where the Twin Towers once stood. The Museum's dynamic creates an unforgettable encounter with the story of the attacks, their aftermath, and the people who experienced these events.
- **Harlem Gospel Tour** – Discover Harlem's historic sights and sounds and enjoy live Gospel music in a Harlem church! End your tour with a unique brunch experience because a Sunday in Harlem is not complete without some of the best soul food in New York City!
- **History Buff?** Take the ferry to Ellis Island to visit to visit Ellis Island Immigration Museum. Step into the shoes of immigrant travelers that took the journey to the United States looking for a better future. Then, complete your visit by visiting the Tenement Museum located on the Lower East Side of Manhattan.
- **A Slice of Brooklyn** – Experience pizza and Brooklyn from one end to the other! Taste legendary Sicilian-style pizza and visit famous Brooklyn movie locations like Saturday Night Fever, Goodfellas, the French Connection and more!
- **See a TV Show or simply tour NBC Studios** – NYC is home to tons of TV shows that film here regularly. TV shows like *Saturday Night Live*, *The View*, *Late Night with Stephen Colbert*, *The Daily Show*, *Last Week Tonight*, and *Late Night with Jimmy Fallon* all offer free tickets to their tapings.

## The Finger Lakes Region



- **Castle, Lakes & Grapes** – Enjoy a wine tasting experience at the historic 1880's Belhurst Castle on the shores of Seneca Lake.
- **"Make your own glass!"** – Visit Corning Museum of Glass. Try your hands at flameworking, fusing, glassblowing, glass-forming, and sandblasting. Learn about 35 centuries of the history of glass, including a pendant from Northern Mesopotamia from around 1500 BC and more.
- **Sonnenberg Gardens & Mansion State Historic Park** – Enjoy a docent led tour including a visit to nine formal gardens and greenhouses. Then, visit The Finger Lakes Wine Center featuring wines from more than 40 partner wineries from the region.
- **Dinner cruise on the Finger Lakes** – Enjoy a boat cruise on Canandaigua Lake, Skaneateles Lake, Seneca Lake and Cayuga Lake as well as the Erie Canal. Get on the water and see the region from a different angle. Enjoy a narrated tour and learn more about the Finger Lakes Region, including the body of water you are cruising on, all while enjoying its sights.
- **Taughannock Falls State Park** – Enjoy a 2-mile walk to see the Taughannock Falls which plunges 215 feet past rocky cliffs that tower nearly 400 feet above the gorge. Gorge and rim trails offer spectacular views from above the falls and from below at the end of the gorge trail.



## Niagara Falls & Buffalo



- **Maid of the Mist boat tour** – Journey into the heart of one of North America's most powerful waterfalls. Hear the thundering roar of 600,000 gallons of water falling right before your eyes. You'll definitely feel the mighty rush of the mist on your face.
- **Seeking Freedom** – Visit the Underground Railroad Heritage Center which reveal authentic stories of freedom seekers and abolitionists in Niagara Falls.
- **Wet your Whistle & Wing it** – A must stop is the Ulrich's 1861 Tavern, Buffalo's oldest watering hole. If the wall could talk, they would probably share the story of when the U.S. Secret Service stopped by when President Grover Cleveland was in town and ordered potato pancakes. Then, make a pilgrimage to the Anchor Bar, the birthplace of the Buffalo Wings and the spot that changed the course of American food history in 1964!
- **Evening Entertainment** – From performing arts and playhouses to comedy clubs and casinos, Buffalo offers all sorts of ways for you to have fun when the night goes down. For example, listen to the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra in the acoustically perfect Kleinhans Music Hall or see a touring Broadway production in the opulent Shea's Performing Arts Center.
